Lincoln Co. Fair Queen and Princess Contest Rules

1. Contestants are limited to Lincoln County residents
2. Queen contestants must be age 14 through 21 at Fair time.
3. Princess contestants must be age 8 through 13 at Fair time.
4. The contestants will be judged on the following:
 - Personality
 - Poise
 - Attire
 - Horsemanship
 - Personal Interview
 - Impromptu Questions
5. The Queen and Princess will be **required** to represent Lincoln County during the Fair and Rodeo and at different functions throughout the year. They must be present and participate in the Fair Rodeo Grand Entries both days. They must also represent the Fair and Rodeo in at least three county events during the year. These events could include the Labor Day Parade in Pioche, LCHS and/or PVHS Homecoming Parades, Homecoming Parade in Caliente, Rachel Days in Rachel, 4th of July Parade in Alamo, or Pioneer Days in Panaca. It will be optional for the Queen and/or Princess to attend out of county events to represent Lincoln County. These events could include the Dixie Roundup Rodeo in St. George, Sept. PRCA Rodeo in Cedar City or the Clark County Fair and Rodeo in Logandale. They will also be required to assist with the Queen and Princess Contest the following year by demonstrating the pattern for the contestants and being present at the crowning of the next year's Queen and Princess.

6. The Prizes awarded the Queen, Princess and Attendants will be as follows:
Queen: Buckle, Crown and Sash and \$100 traveling money.
Princess: Buckle, Crown and Sash and \$50 traveling money.
Attendants: Prizes, flowers.
7. If the Queen should marry, or fail to appear as required she will forfeit her crown and her travel money.

General Rules & Regulations

Entries

1. *Competition in ALL divisions is open to all Lincoln Co. residents.*
2. *Please note the special regulations, dates and times for exhibit entries in each division.*
3. *Entries may be delivered and displayed only after exhibitor has obtained a tag and number from the exhibits registrar.*
4. *All entries must be received between 10 am to 3 pm on August 6.*

Exhibits

1. *Exhibits must be the handiwork of the exhibitor and must have been completed within the last three years.*
2. *Exhibits may enter more than one entry per class, and may enter as many classes as desired, unless stated otherwise. A "set" is classified as one entry.*
3. *The exhibitor is responsible for deciding on the proper class and lot per entry.*
4. *Exhibits may be disqualified if found soiled, damaged or have signs of excessive wear.*
5. *Exhibitor's name will not be shown until the judging has been completed.*
6. *Exhibits must be identified with tags provided by Exhibits Registrar.*
7. *Any exhibit in questionable taste will not be accepted for public display.*
8. *The Exhibit Hall will be locked nightly.*
9. *All exhibits; must remain on display until **4 p.m. Saturday, August 8th.***
10. *All exhibits are entered and displayed at the risk of the owner.*
11. *Lincoln County Fair Board will not be responsible for loss or damage, but will use every reasonable precaution to protect entries.*
12. *No exhibits may be advertised for sale, but exhibitors may enclose, in an envelope, a 3" x 5" card showing name, address and telephone number which will be displayed after judging is completed.*

13. *Exhibitors of animals, machinery in motion, or other exhibits susceptible to accident shall safeguard said exhibits; shall protect the public from injury by or danger from said exhibits, shall relieve the Lincoln County Fair Board and volunteers from and against all claims, demands, cost charges, and/or expenses that the Lincoln County Fair Board or volunteers may suffer or be put to by reason of negligence of the exhibitor, and shall reimburse the Lincoln Co. Fair Board for necessary expenses incurred to protect the public from said exhibit.*

Judging & Awards

1. *Grand Champion or Reserve Champion awards will be given to the top two entries in each section where possible.*
2. *When there is a single entry in a class, the award will be made on merit alone.*
3. *Entries will be judged on: workmanship, overall appearance, beauty and originality of design, and harmony of color and material.*
4. *Only Judges and Clerks may be present in the area while judging is taking place.*
5. *Should it be found that any exhibitor has obtained an award by false evidence or violation of any Fair Rules, said exhibitor shall forfeit all awards.*

- 2. All entries in canning jars shall consist of two jars, one to display and one for opening and judging. The opened containers may be picked up any time after judging to prevent spoilage.*
- 3. All entries in canning jars must be labeled on how it was processed and length of time of processing. All preserved foods (except dried or smoked) must be displayed in clear, standard canning jars. All quarts, pints and jelly jars are acceptable if sealed with standard lids and rings. Low-acid and non-acid foods must be processed under pressure. High-acid foods may be water-bath processed, if desired. No paraffin wax-sealed, oven-processed, baby food jars or other containers will be acceptable. Please clearly label jars with name of contents, method and date of processing.*
- 4. All dried or smoked foods should be displayed in*

clear packing. Please clearly label container with name of contents, date and method of drying or smoking. No frozen foods (except freezer jam) will be accepted.

- 5. All perishable foods must be displayed on/in a disposable container, covered with clear plastic wrap, or may be displayed on/in container of your choice but container must be clearly marked with your name. All perishable foods will be judged on presentation.*
- 6. All food products opened and/or tasted by the judges will be discarded after the Fair if not picked up.*

Trueness to type of that variety, (3) Good quality – neither too mature or immature, (4) Represent uniformity in size, shape and color, (5) Without insect, disease or mechanical injury, (6) Provide tops and roots attached when requested, (7) Remove soil particles, broken or severely blemished leaves or petals, trash, etc., (8) Place exhibit on an appropriately sized clean white paper or plastic plate provided at the Exhibit Reception area.

- 5. Judges are qualified in the field of horticulture according to recognized national guidelines.*
